## Advanced Diploma of Screen and Media CUA60620 – Film and Television Stream



The **Advanced Diploma of Screen and Media** focusing on Film and Television provides students with an inspired approach to the development and creation of film and television content for the screen and media industries, emphasising the conceptual, technical and organisational aspects of production processes.

Major study areas focus on producing, production planning, art direction, advanced cinematography, editing, post-production and visual effects, colour grading, scriptwriting, development and interpretation, directing cast and crew. Students at this level will be able to develop productions independently, collaborate with others, focus on a chosen area of interest and manage projects from conception to completion.

The course is designed to equip students with a combination of practical skills, critical thinking skills and cultural and work ready attributes to prepare them for a career in the screen and media industries. The course offers hands-on learning in a collaborative environment.

### Course Structure

To achieve the Advanced Diploma of Screen and Media, students are required to complete sixteen (16) units in total. Four (4) core units and eleven (12) elective units.

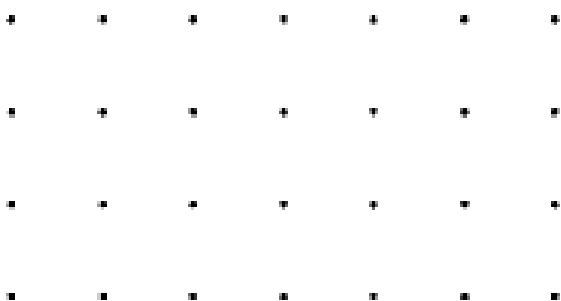
