Essential requirements for admission

Extra requirements

CASPer

All applicants must sit the CASPer test. CASPer is a requirement for many of the initial training courses in Victoria. It is a non-cognitive online test designed to assess an applicant's personal and professional attributes. LANTITE

To become a registered teacher with the Victorian Institute of Teaching, you must pass the <u>Literacy</u> <u>and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education</u> (LANTITE) before completing 200 credit points of study. This test is run externally and at the applicant's own cost. Applicants must disclose all attempts in their application.

Working with Children (WWC) Check

Applicants will be required to hold a Working with Children (WWC) Check prior to undertaking professional placements as part of this course. For more information see: http://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au

Police record check

A Police record check may be required by a school prior to a professional placement.

A. Applicants with recent secondary education (within past two years)

ATAR

This course uses the ATAR as part of its selection considerations.

Guaranteed ATAR: If you receive an ATAR of 70 or higher and meet all the essential requirements for this course, you will be guaranteed an offer.

Educational history

An applicant's entire academic history, including ATAR results, will be considered for entry into this course.

Selection rank adjustments

Selection ranks for this course will be calculated based on your ATAR with adjustments to overall study scores based on subjects studied, location of your home address, SEAS application, and participation in



Swinburne's Early Leaders program. For further details about selection rank adjustments, see <u>Admissions</u> at <u>Swinburne</u>.

Subject Adjustments

A study score of 25 in any Business, any Humanities, any Information Technology, any LOTE or any Mathematics equals 2 aggregate points per study. Overall maximum of 10 points.

Meeting course prerequisites

Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 25 in English other than EAL or at least 30 in English (EAL).

B. Applicants with higher education study

Educational history

An applicant's entire academic history, including results from previous higher education study will be considered for entry into this course. If previous higher education qualifications are incomplete, results must have been obtained in the last seven years.

Meeting course prerequisites

C. Applicants with vocational education and training

Educational history

An applicant's entire academic history from the past 7 years, including complete and/or incomplete postsecondary VET studies, will be considered for entry into this course. Only graded results will be considered.

As for Year 12 or equivalent.

D. Applicants with work and life experience

Entire academic record

This course uses an applicant's entire academic record as part of its selection considerations, including an applicant's ATAR results from the last seven years can be considered for entry into this course.
